#### Outcome:

The purpose of this project will be to facilitate community led action, decision making and activities to improve the wellbeing of children and young people in Palmerston.

#### **Objectives:**

- To develop a clear picture of the Wellbeing of Children in Palmerston.
- To develop a coordinated community response to evidenced gaps in wellbeing.
- To build a locally driven approach to children's needs in the community.

#### Project Background:

This leadership group was formed in response to a need for strategic collaboration to improve the wellbeing of all children and young people in the NT. There were two key events preceding the formation of this group – a collective impact forum hosted by Child Australia in 2013 and a subsequent forum hosted by Good Beginnings Australia and Anglicare NT in April 2014. Four meetings were held between April – July 2014 and were facilitated by Good Beginnings and Child Australia. During this time a draft "Guiding Principles" document was developed. In June a subgroup was formed to apply for DSS funding to develop a Wellbeing of Children report. Good Beginnings Australia was chosen to auspice the project, which will be governed by the Leadership Group. The Leadership Group has met monthly since September 2014.
