The State of Palmerston's Children and Young People

What does the report tell us about Palmerston?

In bringing together data and the community voice, we found that the data largely supports what the community told us. The report tells us that in Palmerston most children and young people are developing well, however, some are not.

Over the years, there have been some important improvements for families, but many issues are still having a negative impact on children, young people and their families. There are gaps in data available for Palmerston and other areas which means we do not know the extent of some local concerns.

Concerns raised about raising children in Palmerston can only be addressed by the community, services and governments working together.

Planning together

We listened to you...we looked at the data...now we want to work together for action.

Using information from the 'State of Palmerston's children and young people' report, Grow Well Live Well is holding community planning sessions. This is so community members and local service providers are involved in responding to challenges children and young people may experience and plan for building on their strengths.
