There is also room to store some of your materials or unfinished objects (UFOs) if you have recurring bookings.




Get Involved and Entwined!

News from NT GOV Top End Health Service

Palmerston Regional Hospital is planned to open in July 2018 and will operate as a campus of Royal Darwin Hospital. Like many other hospital openings in Australia, our services will open gradually and increase over time.

Palmerston Regional Hospital's Rehabilitation Service

At Palmerston Regional Hospital, we will provide more rehabilitation services with new state-of-the-art facilities including dedicated therapy space, a gym and hydrotherapy pool.

Designed to cater to the Territory's growing demand, we will have 24 beds, which is 25 per cent more capacity than what exists today.

Our rehabilitation service is designed to assist patients over the age of 14 years improve their quality of life by helping them to regain or improve their mobility due to injury, disease or conditions such as:

Acquired brain injury
Spinal cord injury
Stroke and neurological conditions
Vascular conditions and amputation
Post-surgical and medical deconditioning
Major burns
Multi-trauma or orthopaedic injuries.

Palmerston Regional Hospital's Geriatric Evaluation and Management Service

Palmerston Regional Hospital will provide services designed to improve the quality of life and mobility for older and frailer people who have been affected by serious illness or injury.

We call this our geriatric evaluation and management (GEM) service.

GEM involves early identification of patients who would benefit from services which reduce the need for patients to stay in Royal Darwin Hospital longer than they need to, and prevents readmittance into hospital after discharge.

This includes short-term inpatient and outreach rehabilitation, by a team of doctors, nurses and allied health staff.

Palmerston Regional Hospital will be the NT's primary hospital specialising in this kind of care. Royal Darwin Hospital will remain the Top End's only tertiary referral hospital. It will continue to specialise in major emergency and complex trauma care.

When it opens, Palmerston Regional Hospital will help Royal Darwin Hospital by providing it with the capacity to expand its focus on providing critical, complex and specialist care.

GEM services from Royal Darwin Hospital will be transferred across to Palmerston Regional Hospital, and the hospital will open with 16 inpatient beds, in addition to providing consultation and outpatient services. Over the first 12 months, services will expand to accommodate 24 inpatients.

HOME LIBRARY SERVICE

Being housebound for any reason can be a hard time for anyone, young or old. Sometimes, a friendly face and a good book can make all the difference.

The Home Library Service provides library materials to Palmerston residents who are unable to access the library. A network of dedicated volunteers and staff select, deliver and return library materials on behalf of a home library borrower. The Home Library Service brings a library service to the community, offering short or long term solutions to meet individual needs as well as valuable social contact.

WHAT YOU CAN BORROW

Full borrowing privileges are offered to our Home Library Service members. Items are selected using a reading preference form. This is based on the likes and dislikes provided by the member to the team upon joining the Home Library Service.
