

**ZUCCOLI:** City of Palmerston is creating a new and exciting community asset for Palmerston people. The Hub will be a place for Palmerston people to come together and enjoy a space that will connect family, friends and the community. The proposed design creates a focal point offering something for everyone, including, walking trails, a dog park, a garden of reflection, a pump track and playground.

The site is well positioned, catering for Palmerston's family friendly suburbs and is accessible for cars, public transport, pedestrians and cyclists. City of Palmerston's forward thinking has identified the gaps in this community and feels the hub will provide much needed social infrastructure for residents living in Zuccoli, Johnston and the wider community.

# **GET TECH SAVVY!**


Whether it is help using your computer, tablet or phone or you want to learn about online banking, shopping and use social media, City of Palmerston Library has you covered!


#### **GET FIT PALMERSTON!**

The 50+ club is where you will find good company in a friendly environment and great fun is guaranteed.


