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In Weed News...

The new Truxor (Weed Harvester) is expected to be available for use in City of Palmerston Lakes by July 2022, subject to timely international shipping customs clearances. The Truxor is due to commence its long journey from Sweden in the middle of March. Since May 17th 2021 the harvester over 1600 cubic meters of weed has been removed from the lakes. This is the equivalent of 560 tonnes of Salvinia, 10,000 Salvinia weevils have been added to the lakes since the harvesting recommenced, more weevils will be added to each lake as the harvesting continues. In other weed news, Gamba grass spraying is occurring across the municipality. All bushland areas at Marlow Lagoon have been treated for Gamba as well as Archer oval

and Archer landfill.









Time to talk about aged care

It's never too early or too late to talk about plans for your care as you age. If you need help understanding the aged care system for yourself, a friend or family member, COTA NT's Aged Care Navigator Janet Brown can assist. Janet provides free, independent and confidential information about:

'The aged care system in the Northern Territory
'Support services for people living in their own home
'Eligibility and how to access services.

You can chat one-to-one with her and she can describe the types of subsidised age services and supports available in Palmerston, how you can access age services; and how to compare services, facilities and prices. She can also explain your rights and responsibilities in receiving services and much more.

Gaining this understanding starts with a conversation. Janet can listen and talk to you via the telephone, video conferencing using Telehealth or face-to-face where possible.

It's important to know what your options are.

It is all about helping you to remain as independent as possible, safely in your own home and to maintain a health and active life. As always, prevention is better than cure, being prepared means having more control over your future. The earlier assistance is provided the less likely you are to enter aged care support in a crisis situation.
