



CITY OF PALMERSTON SWELL PROJECT UPDATE

SWELL days ahead in Palmerston.

City of Palmerston is proud to deliver on its vision for an aquatic lifestyle precinct unlike any other in the Top End. The Swimming, Wellness, Events, Leisure and Lifestyle (SWELL) precinct is Palmerston's largest infrastructure project to date and is set to transform the current ageing Palmerston Swimming and Fitness Centre into a state-of-the-art leisure hub right here in Palmerston.

Construction of SWELL is progressing well with the facility currently set to open to the public later this year.

Significant construction milestones have been met across many elements of the contemporary, family-friendly water and lifestyle precinct. Essential underground and civil works are complete including upgrades to pool services such as plumbing and electricity.

In the coming months, work will commence on refurbishing the existing building and laying foundations for the basketball half-court. Construction of the new pools also continues with focus shifting to building internal ramps that will facilitate a more user friendly with accessible pool entry points for all abilities

The adventure playground and shade sails are being produced, ready to be installed onsite later this year.

A PLACE FOR PEOPLE

AN ADVENTURE PLAYZONE UNLIKE ANY OTHER IN THE TOP END

An adventure playground unlike any other in the Top End is under construction in Palmerston. In addition to the 50 metre pool and the toddler splash and play pool, SWELL includes a water based obstacle course and playground. The adventure playground is a multi-level water playzone that will offer the ultimate water and high-ropes fun for the young, and young at heart.

The adventure playground has a mix of water based features and physical challenge elements. The high ropes course includes a traditional harness safety system for those challenging this part of the water course.

City of Palmerston Mayor, Athina Pascoe-Bell is looking forward to seeing people safely traverse between the towers, walkways and across a series of bridges and ropes.

"Showers of spray and interactive water jets will be sure to keep excitement levels high and everyone cool."

The adventure playground is designed for varying levels with lower tracks perfect for younger children and higher tracks that will appeal to teens and adults.

"The interactive nature of the adventure playground paired with the different zones makes it a perfect experience for families, community groups and schools," said Athina.

"The adventure playzone at SWELL is broken into different zones and levels of difficultly and water saturation. The tracks close to the ground will allow our smaller children to have fun and feel safe while the high tracks will appeal to those that crave the bigger thrills."

There is also a dry area nearby so that parents and carers can keep a watchful eye on children.

Athina says that she is happy with the progress of the development and is pleased that the SWELL construction including the adventure playground, is going well so far, still anticipating an opening date late in 2023.

"Come the end of the year, there will be hours of free weekend and school holiday entertainment for tweens and teens at the all new SWELL facility."

The upgraded facility will include a purpose-built learn to swim and wellness program pool and family-friendly activity features for all ages and abilities.

Palmerston residents can still focus on fitness and wellbeing at the inclusive and accessible gym while the pool and events areas are under construction. ABOUT CONSTRUCTION

Construction of City of Palmerston's SWELL is creating a number of local construction and operation

Early stages of construction began in August 2022 with the new facility expected to open in November 2023.

The Palmerston swimming pool remains closed while work on the new, state of the art SWELL aquatic facility is undertaken. The fitness centre will remain open, with any disruptions to services communicated to users and nearby residents in advance.

City of Palmerston is working with Jaytex Construction to ensure the impacts of construction on surrounding residents, schools and businesses are managed. Measures will be in place to minimise the impacts caused by construction, including the timing of works, traffic management, waste management, and noise and safety measures.

Those impacted by disruptive works or night works will receive advance notice and City of Palmerston will work with stakeholders to ensure business operations can continue throughout construction.

The project is backed and funded by the Australian Government, with \$5 million secured through the Building Better Regions Fund, as well as the Northern Territory Government contributing \$7.5 million and City of Palmerston contributing \$6.9 million.
