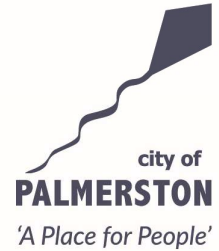


# ELECTION SIGNS



## 2025 LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTION

### DEFINITION

Election advertising means advertising erected in association with the holding of a local government, Northern Territory or Federal election.

### PRIVATE PROPERTY

Election signs may be placed on private property provided they:

- are placed no earlier than six weeks before an election
- are removed within one week after the election or in compliance with relevant electoral legislation
- are not placed on public land, including Council and Northern Territory Government land
- do not obstruct the view of vehicles and/or pedestrians
- do not exceed an area of 1.5m<sup>2</sup>.

### CITY OF PALMERSTON LAND

Election signs cannot be placed on Council land.

City of Palmerston may remove election signs from land it owns and controls if:

- an adjoining landowner lodges a complaint
- a sign does not comply with any of the election sign criteria.

### NORTHERN TERRITORY GOVERNMENT ROADS

Most roads in the Palmerston municipality are controlled by the City of Palmerston but some are controlled by the Northern Territory Government (NTG).

Election signs placed on NTG roads are to comply with the NTG Election Signage Policy found at <https://dli.nt.gov.au/about-us/policies/election-signage-and-mobile-roadside-booths-policies>.
