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DOMESTIC AND FAMILY VIOLENCE

No More

No More is an initiative in the Northern Territory (NT) dedicated to ending domestic and family violence. They engage with workplaces to increase awareness, education and challenge the norms that enable gender-based violence. The Stand Campaign honours over 90 women lost to domestic and family violence since 2000 in the NT and encourages organisations to commit to 90 Domestic Violence Action Plans in 90 days, representing real steps towards change. City of Palmerston aim to work with No More to contribute towards this important message.

Domestic violence

This refers to a pattern of abusive behaviour to control a partner. It can include many different forms, physical, sexual, emotional and verbal and often involves coercive control, where fear, manipulation and isolation are used to dominate someone over time.

Family violence

This extends beyond partner relationships and includes violence between parents and children, siblings and extended family members.

Violence against women

Approximately 91% of people recognise that violence against women is a problem in Australia **BUT** 40% still don't know where or how to access support.

Instead of:

- The NT has the highest rate of domestic and family violence in the nation.
- On average, the NT is three times higher than the national average and five times higher than other jurisdictions.
- One in three women experience intimate partner violence.
- Since 2000, more than 90 women have been killed in the Territory.

We want:

- The NT to be known for our culture, beauty and lifestyle.
- Every Territorian to feel safe and thrive.

GROUP STATEMENT

This **Domestic and Family Violence Action Plan** has been developed to guide Council's contribution to supporting victim-survivors, raising community awareness and working alongside partners to break the cycle of violence. It reflects our organisation's values and our vision of "A Place for People", a city where all residents feel safe, respected, and supported.

City of Palmerston is committed to promoting a safe and supportive community for all residents. Domestic and family violence is a serious issue that affects individuals, families, and the broader community. Council aims to support initiatives related to domestic and family violence, with a focus on prevention, through providing supporting services and actions where possible.

The Action Plan sets out practical and meaningful actions across Council's areas of influence, including:

- Building staff capability through training and awareness.
- Providing our own staff with education on entitlements of leave and internal practices.
- Providing immediate support and information through Council facilities.
- Raising awareness via symbolic and visible initiatives such as Purple Benches and "No More" messaging.
- Supporting prevention and recovery through in-kind support for community groups.
- Strengthening partnerships and accountability to ensure coordinated and lasting impact.

This is not an Action Plan Council can deliver alone. It complements the work of specialist services, government agencies, and community organisations, while ensuring Council leads where it can through safe public spaces, visible leadership, and practical support for residents.

By implementing this Action Plan, Council reaffirms its commitment to safety, respect, and wellbeing in Palmerston, ensuring that our city continues to be "A Place for People".
