PAYMENT/HARDSHIP ARRANGEMENTS

Council understands that you may be experiencing difficulties in paying your account during COVID-19, if this is your current situation or you are experiencing any form of hardship then we strongly urge you to contact Council so together we can discuss options and/or arrange a suitable payment plan. Council offers a Rates Concession for residential ratepayers in financial hardship. Residents who are experiencing financial hardship should contact Council's Finance team as soon as possible to discuss their individual circumstance.

Eligible Commercial Ratepayers on the Business Hardship Register may also apply for a Rates Concession under Council's Public Benefit Concession for Commercial Ratepayers Policy.

Council ratepayers who are unable to meet a payment deadline please contact Council to discuss a payment arrangement. An interest rate of 9% on any outstanding amount will apply.

HOW COUNCIL CALCULATES YOUR RATES

Council uses Unimproved Capital Value (UCV) as a basis for all rating calculations within the City of Palmerston. The UCV amount is calculated every three years by the Office of the Valuer-General. Council also sets a Minimum Rate to ensure all rateable assessments make a reasonable contribution toward maintaining the services and infrastructure within the City of Palmerston.

RESIDENTIAL WASTE MANAGEMENT CHARGE

The standard Waste Service Charge for this financial year is \$490. This includes:

- Provision and collection of a 120L mobile domestic garbage bin twice a week, and a 240L mobile recycling bin once a fortnight.
- · Access to Archer Waste Management Facility.
- Pre-Cyclone Clean-Up
- · City-wide cleaning and waste management.
