myPalmerston brings over \$3.5 million dollars to local Palmerston businesses

The myPalmerston discount voucher scheme has ended, with the \$600,000 kitty being exhausted.

Since launching in April, the 2022 round saw almost 6,000 customers and 95 businesses participating in the scheme, injecting a whopping \$3,516,637.36 into the local Palmerston economy.

The top three businesses were:

- Golden Nails 5,250 vouchers redeemed, with a total spend of \$76,650
- Covai Café 2,905 vouchers redeemed, with a total spend of \$41,510
- Driver Supermarket 2,590 vouchers redeemed, with a total spend of \$33,105

City of Palmerston Mayor Athina Pascoe-Bell praises Territorians for continuing to support and shop locally.

"I want to thank everyone who registered and actively participated in the myPalmerston voucher scheme again this year. In a matter of months, the scheme has injected over \$3.5 million into our local economy."
