City of Palmerston one step closer with New Animal Management By-Laws

Following a second round of community consultation, City of Palmerston's new Animal Management By-Laws are one step closer to be implemented on 1 July 2024.

The community sentiment was positive overall, as Palmerston residents shared their thoughts on the new By-Laws online, over the phone, via email and in-person.

Feedback from the most recent consultation saw some amendments made to the By-Laws, which now endorsed by Council, will go to Parliamentary Counsel to undertake the gazettal process, with implementation on track for 1 July 2024. Key changes include:

- Embracing modern and contemporary practices based on community expectations;
- Provisions for management and ownership of cats and other animals;
- A review of prescribed penalties in relation to offences;
- Improvements to licensing requirements and the registration of dangerous animals; and
- Compulsory microchipping for cats and dogs.

City of Palmerston Mayor, Athina Pascoe-Bell recognises that new, contemporary Animal Management By-Laws are required for Palmerston. "We have worked with stakeholders and utilised community feedback from 2021 and 2024 to develop modern By-Laws that will move us forward as a community to live in harmony with all animals and promote better animal ownership and care."

"We thank all Palmerston residents who shared their thoughts on the new By-Laws and we are looking forward to creating a positive and safe environment for animals, as well as reducing the risk to the community of nuisance or dangerous animal behaviour." she said.
