



My office will keep in contact with Australia Post and monitor the progress of these installations.





The letter received from Mr Snowdon, Member for Lingiari on 5 February 2021 (attached) indicates a favourable outcome to the Committee's request. Two red postal boxes will be provided to the Palmerston community; at Bakewell Shopping Centre and Zuccoli Plaza.

2. Gray Community Hall Redevelopment Update:

Council's Deputy CEO and Director Lifestyle and Community will provide a summary of outcomes from the 2020 community consultation, and an overview of progress to date, along with anticipated development timelines.

User groups will continue to be directly consulted with regarding any evolving issues in regard to the redevelopment and subsequent reopening of the Gray Community Hall.


