## City of Palmerston Response:

City of Palmerston inclusion of cat management is to promote and ensure responsible animal management and welfare and was informed by the community's desire for the inclusion of cat management following initial community consultation 2021.

An example of an advantage of cat registration is that should your cat go missing or be found roaming it is easier to reunite them with their owners.
